#### **Delicious Information and Tags**

When entering the information into Delicious, I started each item with the search term natural\_disaster. I wanted one search term that would be common for all items for this project. After this general search term, I listed the type of disaster that took place - such as flood, earthquake, tsunami, explosion, tornado, eruption, volcano, or blizzard. Next, I always entered the country that was affected by the disaster. Similarly, I entered the year that the disaster took place. This helped to narrow things because I found that several countries had the same type of disasters during different years. My next tag that I found helpful was the type of resource I was cataloging at the time. I wanted to include if the image was a video, journal, image, webpage, atlas, almanac, encyclopedia, dictionary, or book. I found this helpful as I revisited the tags to make sure that I had found various types of sources for each of the disasters. Finally, I tried to include the word "fee" if the resource was one that needed to be purchased by the user since this may influence if my client would be willing to use this resource.

#### RefWorks Information and Folders

After entering the information for the resources into Delicious, I then grabbed the resource for RefWorks. I organized the information into folders by the type of disaster that I was researching at the time. I also created a folder for miscellaneous information, information that was about basic natural disasters that could be used by any student. This information included a lot of the ready reference information for almanacs, encyclopedias, atlases and dictionaries. It also includes general information about natural disasters.

Another folder that I created to help my client was a writing folder. This folder contains information on 6 Traits writing and the Big 6 Research Process. My client and the students will be using both of these to grade the projects that are being created for this assignment so I thought it would be helpful to link information and rubrics about both of these.

My RefWorks tags are quite simple but the client can quickly search by the name of the disaster and type of disaster, along with location and date because theses are all tags.
